Public Information (P.I.): Area 9 has an active and productive Public Information Committee and District 5's P.I. Chair is an active member. Area 9 has announced the 2nd Annual Public Information Workshop will be held on Sunday, September 16 from 8:30 to 2:30 at the VFW Hall, 805 E. Sycamore Street, Anaheim, CA. There will be several speakers who will share their experiences and insights as members of the community who cooperate with AA. The workshop will address the issues, "What AA is and what AA is not" and "How AA can help." ASK A SERVICE SPONSOR

I'm afraid of the responsibility if I take a General Service commitment. How does that kind of service help my recovery? There's a reason AA talks about taking commitments instead of taking responsibilities. When I take a General Service or meeting commitment I'm putting into action my willingness to serve my fellow alcoholics. The commitment I make is that I will take certain actions for a certain length of time on a day-at-a-time basis. If I commit to being the secretary of a meeting I'm agreeing to show up, unlock the door, bring the format, and take other actions t he group has assigned to a meeting secretary. The results of those actions are the responsibility of a Higher Power. I can't guarantee that I will always be available, or that I will always do it perfectly. I only agree that I will do my part, and then I do it. I make the effort and God handles the results. How does this help my recovery? Any time I put the program into action in my life I find I benefit from it. I learn more and more about what is my part, what is not, and about practicing these principles in all my affairs.
