#### Our Purpose


The Principal Purposes of District 7 are:

- A. Carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers
- B. To keep the lines of communication open between A.A. World Services and the individual Groups through full registration and representation of all active groups within the District's geographical boundaries.
- C. To develop knowledgeable and experienced General Service Representatives (GSRs) through the study, practice and continued application of the Twelve Traditions, Twelve Concepts, the Six Warranties and other principles of service as contained the AA Service manual.
- D. To elect District Committee Chair (DCMC), District Committee Members (DCMs) and other Officers from these trusted servants to represent District 7 at the Area Service Committee meetings and to participate with GSR's at Assemblies and other MSCA Area 9 functions.
- E. To maintain A.A. World Service in the spirit of the Seventh Tradition by encouraging all Groups within the District's boundaries to establish and participate in a regular financial contribution plan.
- F. To strengthen District 7 Groups through service work to ensure that the opportunity to recover from alcoholism through the practice of the Twelve Steps and the Twelve Traditions will be available for future alcoholics.

## **District Description**

The description of the district is:

- A. District 7 is part of the Mid-Southern California Area (Area 9) in the Pacific Region of the General Service Conference Structure. It is located in Orange County, California. District 7 includes the cities of Garden Grove, Stanton, Midway City and Westminster. The borders of District 7 are specified in the "Atlas of Mid-Southern California Area".
- B. There are four (4) sub-districts in District 7. The sub-districts are:
  - 1. NE—North of Garden Grove Blvd. and East of Gilbert
  - 2. NW—North of Garden Grove Blvd. and West of Gilbert
  - 3. SE—South of Garden Grove Blvd. and East of Bushard extended North
  - 4. SW—South of Garden Grove Blvd. And West of Bushard extended North



Note: Meetings are not placed strictly based on these sub-district geographic boundaries to allow a reasonable distribution of meetings between the two Alano Clubs where the majority of the meeting are held.
